

Methods of Presentation

Brainstorming/ mindmapping	These techniques are used to generate ideas and information from the group. There are no 'right or wrong' answers as participants write down or share as many ideas as they can think of.
Carouselling	This is a strategy for generating ideas and information from the group on several topics. Post several sheets of flipchart paper around the room with topic headings on each. Ask participants to move from topic to topic, in small groups, and add their ideas.
Card game	Use index cards with printed labels to allow participants to manipulate, sort, arrange or order information.
Comics/cartoons/ SDG resources for children	Comics and cartoons when selected and used well, can be a great way to highlight the key points, to help participants relate to the topic/issue, and to rejuvenate the group through the use of humour.
Debates	Individuals or small groups choose different positions relative to a theme and present their points supporting their side.
Games	Games are useful for review of materials – make up your own versions of popular TV game shows
Individual exercises	Participants individually complete an activity
Partner activity	Pairs complete an activity or task

Small group activity	Small groups complete an activity or task
Small group discussion	Small groups discuss a topic or generate their own ideas on a given subject (ask WHY questions)
Songs, chants, raps and rhymes	These can be generated by the facilitator or the participants – create a short song, chant or rap about the issue/theme
Whole group discussion	Entire group discusses a topic or activity – usually used after individual, partner or small group activities to share their ideas or experiences
Use of technology	To add value to all above methods
